



Respect Competition Guidelines

General information

The Stop it at the Start campaign is asking students in years 4–9 to create a visual story about what respect looks like in your world. Students are invited to draw a storyboard with the winning entry turned into a 30 second animation by a professional animator!

Who can enter

There are two categories for the competition:

- 1. Students in year 4–6 (primary school)
- 2. Students in year 7–9 (high school).

Entries will be accepted from individuals, groups, and entire classes (there is no limit on the size of a team).

Each entry form must include a main point of contact (this can be a teacher or other adult), the name of your school and a contact person.

What to do

Using the storyboard template create your own story about respect.

You can use a maximum of 8 boxes to design and tell us all about what respect means to you. There is space for both the illustration or visual description, and the text underneath to explain what is happening in each illustration.

When you are designing your storyboard, think about having a start, a middle, and an end. Don't forget:


- To include the word 'respect' as part of your design.
- All characters must be fictional and not depict identifiable real people.
- Do not use harmful language, profanities or depictions of violence.

Stuck on a topic? Here are a few suggestions to help you get started:

- What does respect mean to you?
- How would you teach someone about respect
- Finish the story:
 - You're watching reels online when 'ping' you get a message...
 - As you're walking through the playground you notice something strange...

The storyboard template

This is an example of how to use the storyboard template. The large box is for the drawing or the visual description of the scene in your story, and the other box is for you to describe what is happening in the story.



A child enters a classroom on their first day at school. They are early to the classroom. Will people be nice to them on day one at school?

Prize

A panel of judges will select winners and runners-up for each competition category.

Each winner will have their storyboard created into a 30 second animation by a professional animator and published on www.respect.gov.au. Each winner will also receive:

- 1 x \$500 gift card for the student(s) entering the competition
- 1 x \$500 gift card for the school

Five runners-up from each category will receive 1 x \$250 gift card.

This means in each age category there is a \$500 gift card up for grabs for the winning storyboard and a \$500 gift card for your school too, as well as $5 \times 250 gift cards for the runners-up.

Entry information

You are only allowed to submit one group or individual storyboard entry. Please fill out either the Individual entry form or the Group entry form.

Remember, you need to complete a separate consent form for each member of a group entry.

Entries close Sunday 15 September 2024 at 11:59pm. All entries are be emailed to respectcompetition@dentsu.com

Please ensure your entry includes:

- 1. your finished storyboard
- 2. your signed parental consent form (if you are entering as a group, all entrants must have an individual consent form)
- 3. your completed individual or group entry form.

All submissions must be:

- No larger than 5MB
- Provide content to enable an animation no longer than 30 seconds in length
- In the provided competition template
- Submitted in PDF format

Additional information

- Entries can be submitted in any language.
- Ensure you read the Terms and Conditions on www.respect.gov.au before entering.
