What is a storyboard?

A storyboard is a series of drawings that helps to show the main parts of a story. The drawings and the words used to describe what is happening will be used to create the animation for the winning entry.

Things to think about

You can use no more than the 8 boxes provided in the template. When you are designing your storyboard, think about what will happen in your story—what happens in the beginning, middle and end of the story.

You must include the word 'respect' as part of the theme or design of your story.

Example

This is an example of how to use the storyboard template. The large box on the top is for your drawing or including a description of what the scene looks like. The box underneath is for you to describe what is happening in the story.
